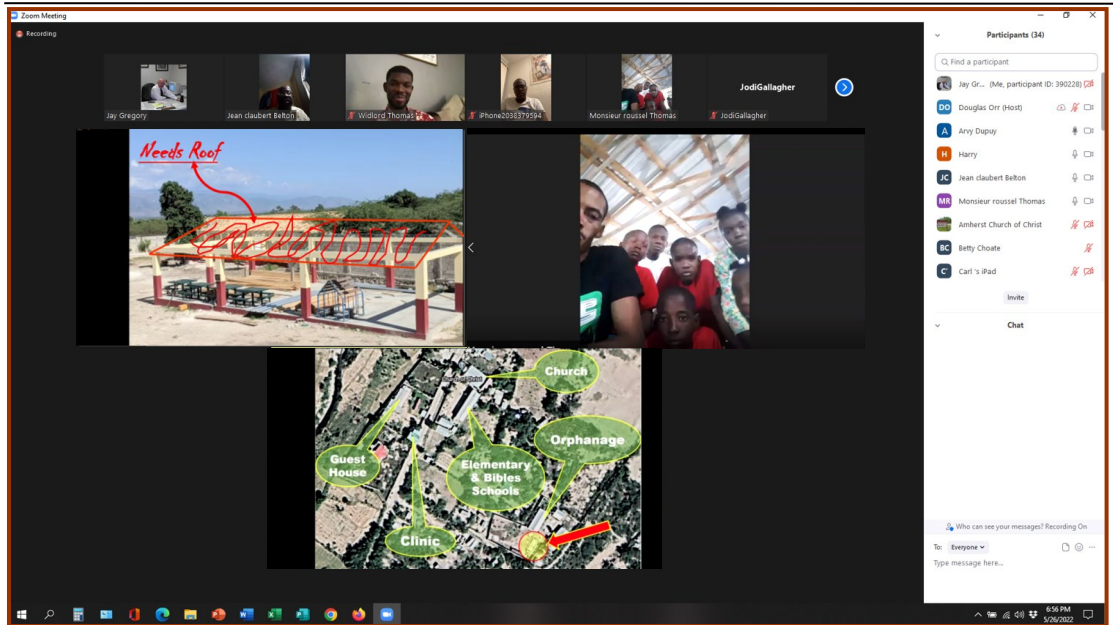

35 Joined First Virtual Mission – Trip May 26th

Mission

Our mission is to help all of our “neighbors” live in the dignity given to mankind when we were created in the image of God. Our desired outcome is that when children “graduate” from Harry’s Home at age 18 they will be physically, spiritually, intellectually, and emotionally healthy; educationally and vocationally equipped to live a full life as a valued productive member of the Bonnette community.



Arvy kicked the meeting off right on time. “Tonight, you’re going to hear from a lot of volunteers here in the United States, and from our family [in Haiti]. Most importantly, the ones everybody wants to see, the children from Harry’s home, are on this call and we will be talking to them live in just a few minutes. So, we’re ready to get started.

Jean Claubert told us the story of how he started a school, with about 150 Kids most of whom could not pay, and 10 of so years later. (there is no “public education” in Haiti), Bonnet School has 10 grades, with about 550 kids, in a two story building. Liberté provides a hot lunch for each of these kids, five days per week.

Then, Dr. Ed Gallagher related that about the same time, Evands and Jean Claubert said their biggest need was to be able to Christian, Haitian ministers. The Haiti School of Biblical Studies was born and has graduated two classes of Gospel ministers.

One of the most impactful moments of the evening came when Widlord Thomas’ shared

the impact his experience, in a home similar to Harry’s, has had on his life.

“Thank you to all of you for what you’re doing for my brothers and sisters in Haiti. I know it’s a difficult time their. I am 36 years old now. I started when I was about 12. I would go to school and graduate. That would not have been possible, if there weren’t a lot of people who were supporting and helping me. Today I can minister and work here in the US, have my own family. So that’s a blessing for me and my life and I know that’s a blessing to all of those kids. Later on, they’re going to benefit from it. It’s a way to the future for them. So, I don’t think there is a word I can really use to thank you for what you’re doing. But the Lord knows, thank you very much.”

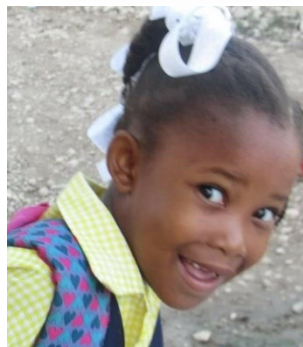

Harry: "Father in Heaven, we thank you for the opportunity to be a part of Your work in Haiti. We're blessed to see these wonderful children coming home to Monsieur Thomas and his wife; who teach them to love you, Lord, and to be good citizens of Haiti."

"Lord, we ask that you bless each one of the children in the school at Bonnet. We ask that you bless Jean Claubert, the staff, the teachers in both of our schools. These days, they have tough times even getting to the school. We pray that You'll watch over them and keep them safe."
